#### **Playground Update**

There was a Public Hearing at the Hardyston Land Use Board on Monday, June 9th. Lake Tamarack Association advocated for the final approval of the new Lake Tamarack Association Playground installation at the Recreational complex.



We thank all our members to attend the meeting. We are happy to report that the Land Use Board approved the Lake Tamarack Playground project!

The installation is being scheduled soon as we are now working with town officials to finalize the permitting process! Needless to say, this process has been tedious and time-consuming. Yet, the Lake Tamarack Board is excited to be granted final approval from the Land Use Board.

We appreciate everyone's support and patience as we navigate these final hurdles to bring forward a improvement to our community, to improve our recreational space, and to provide a safe and worthy playground that will benefit our community for years to come.

### PLANNING COMMITTEE

- We have been working with the Board, Hardyston Twp, and legal counsel to ensure completion of the playground project started last year.
- We have consulted with members of the former Lake Tammarack Environmental Committee to provide landscaping recommendations for the playground area after installation is completed.
- We held our annual Clean Community
  Day in May, in which we repurposed
  one of our old docks to the boat area
  at Beach 2 and added additional
  fencing to the community gardens.
- We held our annual beach clean-up days in June, and our beaches look great!
- We are currently working on repairs to our gangplank at beach 1.
- We continue to look for additional areas of improvement to our lake properties and work closely with the board to create remediation and maintenance plan recommendations.

- The Finance Committee met throughout the winter in preparation of this year's Lake Budget.
- We are reviewing expense trends over the last five years to plan appropriately for the future.

- Stocking was Saturday, March 29 with 275 12-14 inch rainbows, browns, and tiger trout went in plus two 25-26 inch broodstock fish as well.
- The Annual Youth Fishing Contest (aged 15 and under) will be on Father's Day (June 15th) from 10a to 12p. Pizza, snacks, and drinks will be served.
- With a great trout season coming to an end, the final count was one tagged trout, caught and kept.
- The bass are now off their beds, and the season is in full swing!
- We encourage everyone who catches a Lake Tamarack bass to release them ,as they are by far the best game fish that reside in our lake
- For anyone who would like to keep fish to eat, the trout, yellow perch, blue gill, sunfish, and black crappie all make excellent table fare.

### **Meteor Shower Calendar**

Delta Aquarids (July 18-August 21) The Delta Aquarids is an average shower that can produce up to 20 meteors per hour at its peak. You'll typically see plenty of Delta Aquariids mixed in with the Perseids, if you're watching in early August.	Perseids (August 11-13) The Perseids is one of the best meteor showers to observe, producing up to 60 meteors per hour at its peak. The Perseids are famous for producing a large number of bright meteors.	Draconids (October 8) The Draconids is a minor meteor shower producing only about 10 meteors per hour. The Draconids is an unusual shower in that the best viewing is in the early evening instead of early morning like most other showers.
Orionids (October 20-21) The Orionid meteor shower, which runs Sept. 26 to Nov. 22, produces about 15 or 20 meteors an hour but is considered one of the most beautiful shooting star shows of the year.	Taurids (November 5-9) The Taurids is a long-running minor meteor shower producing only about 5-10 meteors per hour. What makes this long-running meteor shower unique is that it consists of two separate streams: the South Taurids' peak November 5, and the North Taurids' peak November 9.	Leonids (November 17-18)  The Leonids meteor shower runs Nov. 3 to Dec. 2 and puts on an average show of about 15 meteors an hour. Radiating from the constellation Leo the Lion, the famous Leonid meteor shower has produced some of the greatest meteor storms in history.
Geminids (December 13-14) The bold, white, bright Geminids give us one of the Northern Hemisphere's best showers, especially in years when there's no moon. Under a dark sky with no moon, you might catch 120 Geminid meteors per hour.	Ursids (December 21-22) This minor meteor shower runs Dec. 13-24 and usually peaks around the December solstice, perhaps offering five to 10 meteors per hour during the predawn hours in a dark sky. In 2025, you'll have dark skies to watch for them all night. And the Ursids are worth a look!	Quadrantids (January 2-3) Under a dark sky with no moon, when the radiant is high in the sky, the Quadrantids can produce over 100 meteors per hour. The Quadrantid shower is one of four major meteor showers each year with a sharp peak (the other three are the Lyrids, Leonids, and Ursids).
